Town of Fort Myers Beach Top Ten for October

- **BUDGET – Council adopted the Town's budget on September 21 with a millage rate of .8700.**
 - **HURRICANE CLEANUP** – As of today, September 27, 2017 we have received the final clearance for large horticultural/vegetation debris collection (the "Claw") to commence. The Contractors will start at the North end of Estero Island and will proceed southward; in an effort to keep the drainage road/wastewater and waterline project progressing expeditiously there may be some diversion from the schedule to facilitate these contractors work.
 - This will be a lengthy process so do not assume that your street was missed but feel free to check the Town's website, Facebook page or call Town Hall for daily updates.
 - Only Horticultural debris that can be visually verified will be collected.
- Debris needs to be separated from trash and garbage. Yard waste and debris must be prepared in accordance with county ordinance before it is set out for collection:
 - Advance Disposal will also be providing there "normal waste collection services including horticultural that adheres to their standard rules for collection. For details: <https://www.leegov.com/solidwaste/post-hurricane-debris-action-guidelines>
- **FEMA INDIVIDUAL ASSISTANCE** – Lee County received a Presidential Declaration which enables Lee residents with losses due to Hurricane Irma who are now eligible for Federal Disaster Assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, or FEMA.
 - a. Impacted residents can go to DisasterAssistance.Gov to register today.
 - b. If unable to register online, or through the FEMA App. please call 800-621-FEMA (3362)
 - c. Applicants will need the following to apply:
 - Social Security Number
 - Daytime telephone number
 - Current mailing address and address and zip code of the damaged property
 - Private insurance information, if available.

By registering for federal assistance on www.DisasterAssistance.gov When an applicant registers, each receives a unique registration number. The registration number is important and should be written down and kept handy. Anyone who does not have a registration number is not yet registered.

- **PERMITS & PLANS – EPLAN IS NOW AVAILABLE** – Community Development has implemented Eplan, a web based application, which allows you to electronically submit your permits online and download the approved plans from your computer.
